Dementia Navigators working with local GP

Dementia Navigator, Sandra Graham has been working alongside the GPs at Tame Valley Medical Centre in Wednesbury, to assist with their patients' annual dementia reviews within the surgery. During the review, GPs carry out a medication review. checked blood pressure and weight and Sandra carried out 'Living Well' check.



The review discovered that not all patients were supported by the Sandwell Community Dementia Service, so she was able to refer them into the service to ensure they have access to support in the community. If the person with dementia, or their loved one, indicated that they needed help during the review; either with practical or emotional support, Sandra was able to arrange a home visit to carry out a needs assessment, to ensure their questions were answered, problems were solved and needs were met.

One element of the Sandwell Dementia Community Service is raising awareness.

Utilising the Alzheimer's Society dementia friends initiative, sessions have been held. A number of sessions have been held within 2 senior schools with Sandwell (St Michaels in Rowley Regis and Holly Lodge in Smethwick).

Attending School Assemblies, Health and Social Care lessons and Student Voice Events. The initiative spared great discussion amongst the pupils even leading to St Michaels inviting some of the parents along to be involved. The 2 schools have allowed us to review our content as well providing us valuable feedback in shaping the awareness sessions for future events at other schools within the borough.

Similar sessions have also been delivered at Day Centres, Housing Support, Leisure Centres, Community Groups, GP Surgeries and Patient Participation Groups.

Brought together by CommonAge, the Commonwealth Association for the Ageing, <u>Dementia in the Commonwealth</u> has recently been published.

It is believed to be the first report on dementia focussing on Commonwealth countries.

The report:

- explores the state of dementia care and support
- highlights disparities and challenges
- showcases best practices
- highlights the need for urgent action to improve the lives of those affect by dementia

The report involved research and collaboration with experts, people living with dementia, healthcare providers, and carers. It also showcases successful models of care across the Commonwealth as templates for improvement.
